FROM OUR PASTOR

Blessing of the Home

In the Lutheran Service Book Agenda there is a rite for the blessing of a home. The Agenda says, "It is appropriate that homes of Christians be blessed by the Word of God and prayer. This rite may be used when a new home is occupied, when a family moves to another home, or at other appropriate times (e.g., following a robbery or vandalizing of a home, following an assault or murder in the home, following fire or other destruction, following renovation of a home)." I would also add that the Blessing of the Home is also good in situations where there is thought to be some sort of demonic activity.

Many do not know about this rite which is why I am writing about it in this month's newsletter. To be clear, this rite of blessing is not something that is mandated by the Word of God. You do not have to have your pastor do a blessing of your house. This is optional and up to you. I am always willing to do this for anyone who asks. Having your pastor do a blessing of your home is optional, but the Word of God and Prayer should always be in all of our homes. The Small Catechism has a wonderful section titled: "How the Head of the Household Should Teach His Family to Pray."

The rite itself consists of readings from Holy Scripture with prayers. For example, one of the prayers in this rite is: "Lord God Almighty, we implore You to bless and sanctify this home, its occupants, and its possessions, enriching them in every way. Drive from here the snares of the evil one and send Your holy angel to guard, protect, visit, and defend all who dwell in this home. Mercifully hear their prayers and, when their last hour comes, grant them safe haven in Your heavenly mansions; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen."

God's peace be with you all, dear Saints of the Lord!

A Lenten Sermon Series on Jesus' Words from the Cross

Written by pastor and Concordia Seminary professor, Dr. David Peter, the series focuses on the words of Jesus that were spoken from the cross. For this newsletter, we'll be looking at

"My God, Why Have You Forsaken Me?"

We have failed God with our sin. Sin causes us to be separated from God. But God's own Son comes to take our place and our punishment by being forsaken by the Father on the cross. This is all so that we are reconciled to the Father.

FIRST READING Isaiah 59:1–2, 12–17 (Our iniquities have separated us from God, but He comes to save us.)

GOSPEL READING Matthew 27:45–49 (Jesus experiences being forsaken by His Father.)

HYMN "Stricken, Smitten, and Afflicted" LSB 451

- 1 Stricken, smitten, and afflicted, See Him dying on the tree! 'Tis the Christ, by man rejected; Yes, my soul, 'tis He, 'tis He! 'Tis the long-expected Prophet, David's Son, yet David's Lord; Proofs I see sufficient of it: 'Tis the true and faithful Word.
- Ye who think of sin but lightly Nor suppose the evil great Here may view its nature rightly, Here its guilt may estimate. Mark the sacrifice appointed, See who bears the awful load; 'Tis the Word, the Lord's anointed, Son of Man and Son of God.
- 4 Here we have a firm foundation, Here the refuge of the lost: Christ, the Rock of our salvation, Is the name of which we boast; Lamb of God, for sinners wounded, Sacrifice to cancel guilt!

MEDITATION

Jesus has come to bear our sin and its punishment. The prophet declares, "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him [Jesus] the iniquity of us all" (Isaiah 53:6). This is why Jesus is being forsaken by his Father. It is because he bears our sin in his body on the tree. On that Friday afternoon when the sun turned dark, all the darkness of sin from all people of all time gathered upon Jesus. He bore our iniquity as he hung teeming with our sins. And the holy face of his Father turned from such unholy sin. The pure light of God's righteousness was repelled by the darkness of our depravity that was laid upon Christ. Because he bore your sin, Jesus became anathema to his Father. Or as the Apostle Paul puts it, Christ became a curse for us, "for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree" (Galatians 3:13).

Jesus did this all for you. He did it so that you would not be cursed of God. He did it so that you need not be separated from the Father

because of your sin. He experienced the forsakenness of God so that you and I might never be so forsaken. Paul explains: "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us" (Galatians 3:13). And: "God made him [Christ] who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21). All so that you and I might be restored to a right relationship with God by the removal of our sin.

PRAYER

Gracious Father, during this season of Lent we reflect upon the suffering and death of our Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ. We acknowledge that it is because of our sin that he suffered, and we repent of that sin. We take comfort in the fact that your beloved Son was forsaken by you because of our sin and in our stead. Guide us to live in a manner worthy of our calling as redeemed people of God. In the precious name of Jesus, we pray. Amen.
