Readings: Jeremiah 20:7–13, Romans 6:12–23, Matthew 10:5a, 21–33

You Now Live before God in the Righteousness of Christ

The outcome of sin is death, *“but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord”* (Rom. 6:23). He has set you free from the slavery of sin and has brought you *“from death to life”* (Rom. 6:13). No longer are you under the condemnation of the Law, but you live *“under grace”* (Rom. 6:14). Such is your courage in the face of *“those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul”* (Matt. 10:28). You abide in the care of your Father in heaven, who numbers *“even the hairs of your head”* and values you more *“than many sparrows”* (Matt. 10:30–31). By the Word of Christ, you have become like Him, your Teacher and Master in whom you endure to the end, and *“will be saved”* (Matt. 10:22, 25). THE LORD'S SUPPER is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another.

Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until he comes. We do this because as members of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod we take very seriously the advice of St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 11:28–29, *A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself.*

Self-Examination. 1. Do I believe that I am a sinner? 2. Do I believe and trust in Jesus Christ as my personal Lord and Savior, from sin, death, and the power of the devil? 3. Do I believe that I receive forgiveness for all of my sins through Christ's true body and blood, present in the Sacrament? (Real presence of Christ's body.) 4. Do I promise to amend (or change) my sinful life with the help of the Holy Spirit?

If you have so examined yourself and are in full agreement with us, and have been instructed, you are welcome to receive the Lord's Supper. If you desire to learn more about these beliefs or are interested in learning how to become a member, please talk to Pastor McKillop or one of the elders. Thank you.
